- 3. Fewer and fewer people study History. What reasons can you think of why we should study the past?
- 4. 'The camera never lies'. Do you agree with this view on the reliability of photographs and/or films as sources of evidence?
 - Be sure to make reference to any sources or films that you have studied. You will not be penalised if you only refer to one of either photographs or films.
- 5. 'I want facts, facts alone are wanted in life' (...from Mr Gradgrind in 'Hard Times' by Charles Dickins). Was Mr Gradgrind right?
 - Be sure to explain your answer. You do not need any knowledge of this book.
- 6. To what extent is the study of local History important? (if at all).
 - You do not need specific knowledge of any one locality.
